-LWSC Members: Games \$5 each, \$3 per rider for team classes. Unlimited classes: \$30/youth (17 under) and \$40/adult (18 & over).

-Non-Members: \$3.00 more a class for Non-Members and \$40.00/youth and \$50/adult unlimited for non-LWSC members.

-Most gaming classes will have two divisions, an open division and a walk/trot division.

#### Games:

- 10) **Polebending (Adult)** – Standard polebending pattern. Gallop up to far end, weave down through poles and back up and then jog/gallop back down to finish line.
- 11) **Polebending (Youth 11-17)** – Standard polebending pattern.
- 12) **Polebending (Kids 10 and under)** – Standard polebending pattern. (weave up and weave down)
- 13) **Western Equitation (Adult)**- rider is judged at the walk, trot/jog, canter/lope in both directions.
- 14) **Western Equitation-(Youth 11-17)** rider is judged at the walk, trot/jog, canter/lope in both directions.
- 15) **Western Equitation-(Kids 10 and under)** rider is judged at the walk, trot/jog, canter/lope in both directions.
- 16) **Western Pleasure (Adult)**: horse is judged at the walk, trot/jog, canter/lope in both directions.
- 17) **Western Pleasure (Youth 11-17)**: horse is judged at the walk, trot/jog, canter/lope in both directions.
- 18) **Western Pleasure (Kids 10 and under)**: horse is judged at the walk, trot/jog, canter/lope in both directions.
- 19) **Western Equitation (lead line division)**: rider is judged at the walk, trot/jog in both directions.
- 20) **Egg and Spoon Class (Adult)** – Traditional egg and spoon. Will be divided into open division and miscellaneous division (lead-line, in-hand, horse show dads, husbands, etc.).
- 21) **Egg and Spoon Class (Youth 11-17)** – Traditional egg and spoon. Will be divided into open division and miscellaneous division (lead-line, in-hand, horse show dads, husbands, etc.).
- 22) **Egg and Spoon Class (Kids 10 –under)** – Traditional egg and spoon. Will be divided into open division and miscellaneous division (lead-line, in-hand, horse show dads, husbands, etc.).

- 23) **Ribbon Pairs (Adult)** – Each pair holds a strip of crepe paper between them while performing various maneuvers without breaking or dropping the paper.

- 26) **Dress-Up Relay** – First rider rides to a bin of clothes, dismounts, puts all the clothes on, remounts, and rides back. Then the second rider puts all the clothes on and rides across the finish line.
- 27) **Rescue Ride** – First rider rides bareback to the second rider, the first rider helps the second rider get on, the two riders ride back together. (THIS IS DONE BAREBACK)
- 28) **Bareback Ride-a-Buck (Adult)** – Riders put a dollar bill between their leg and the horse and perform various maneuvers. If the bill falls they are eliminated. Last remaining rider keeps all the dollar bills.
